ACC

The ACC was created to manage and follow the CC&Rs so our community continues to maintain its nice and neat appearance. The ACC strives to maintain the CC&Rs, finding a balance between allowing individuality and still maintaining community appearance.

Any modification you wish to make to the exterior of your residence or to the landscaping requires ACC approval...PRIOR to the start of the project. This includes, but is not limited to: new windows, new garage door, storm door, solar tubes, and type and name of plants wanted for landscaping.

Things to consider when submitting an ACC application:

- All applications should have as much detail on the project as possible, along with a brochure.
- The ACC will not allow plants generally considered to be invasive or a noxious weed that would disrupt native ecosystems.
- Flowers in your front yard that will have a mature height of under 24 inches, do not need ACC approval.
- All furniture in the front yards must have ACC approval PRIOR to putting in your yards.

IMPORTANT: 811 MUST be called prior to any digging as utility lines are very close to the surface.

If you have questions, call one of us. We don't bite and we want to work with you. Once the project has been completed, it is your responsibility to contact an ACC member to let us know so we can review and sign off on the project.

Landscaping

The trees in our community have had minor trimming or treatment for any issues over their 20+ years. The board has received bids for treatment of bugs, insects, and diseases and also to have our trees trimmed and/or thinned. This is a necessary cost if we want to keep our trees alive and healthy. The increase in dues will help keep our trees healthy and our community looking nice.



Fall Cleanup



Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will do two cycles of leaf cleanup as the leaves drop (estimated in November and December). Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will also come again, when most of the leaves have fallen. Fall shrub trimming and tree trimming will happen later, depending on the weather, with many shrubs being cut back much further before winter.



Snow Removal



At the Annual Meeting, snow removal for the entire complex was voted on and approved. Due to safety, possible legal issues, and the increasing age of our residents, snow removal is being added to the service items covered by our HOA dues rather than having residents pay for this or remove the snow themselves.

Frank McSherry with Flourish Lawn & Yard Services will remove snow when we receive between 2-4 inches of snow. He will look at the weather and will not shovel snow if the temperatures are due to rise with the sun coming out. If snow is predicted for multiple days, snow removal will occur after the snow stops.

Snow will be removed from each sidewalk (from the front door to the driveway and to the mailbox) and driveway. Ice melt will be applied.

Smoke Alarm Battery Replacement
